Classes available to help you Learn !

Your *Laguna Woods Village Mac Club* offers a variety of Classes to help you understand and operate your Macintosh computer.

If you are a Beginner, or new user, or simply want to refresh your memory about how to do fundamental and basic computer activities using your Mac there are several different intro Classes given each month to inform and teach you.

You do not have to be a member of our Club to participate, however, you must be a resident of Laguna Woods Village (or a guest attending with a resident).

Murray Massin offers an informative introductory “*Beginners Computer Information*” session once a month to help those who have never used a computer, or are just curious about the world of computers, or have very little experience operating a Mac computer. No donation is requested to attend this session.

Shell Weinberg presents “*Mac for Dummies*” Class, an overview of the Operating System, covering basics and fundamentals on how to navigate and use the Mac. Open to all questions, generally answered with a demonstration using the projected computer screen. Some hands on exercises.

Wim Vermolen teaches “*OS X Intermediate*” Class for earlier Mac OS users learning OS X, and users who have some experience with OS X and wish to increase their skills. General introduction with a different feature/function highlighted and discussed in detail each session.

Anne Clark offers information and some demonstration in the “*e-Mail / Internet*” Class. Any questions you may have related to sending and receiving e-mail messages, or questions about navigating the Internet, Anne will be prepared to answer and guide you.



Anne Clark also informs and educates Mac users in her “*Digital Photo*” Class. Questions about your digital photos and how they can be copied, cropped, enhanced, improved, straightened, etc., are answered... and also includes other general information related to camera use, the use of “*Photoshop Elements*”, iPhoto, and other digital photo programs.

Michael Moore helps users understand the digital movie making process offering the “*iMovie Q & A*” Class. Class discussion may include information about your camcorder camera, getting the movie into the computer, editing the movie for your special presentation, and how to burn your final production onto a DVD disc.

Craig Hoyt has presented a variety of Classes on a random basis. Interesting and worthwhile subjects in the past have been: “*iCal & iWeb*”, “*Computer Gaming*”, and “*Of Mice & Menus*”. The new year will undoubtedly yield other stimulating offerings and may include a “*Questions and Answers*” Class.

Classes are always held in the Mac Learning Center. All are drop in and do not require a sign up. The time is 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. We ask for a \$2.00 donation for the supplies that support operation of the Learning Center. It is suggested you bring a notebook and pen to make notes.
